The Christian leader must meet conflict with courage, and accept as a personal challenge, any danger to Christian unity.

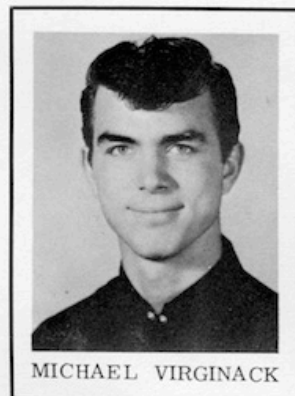
The Christian leader is not perfect, and if he is young, he has much to fight within himself, but he can win, and this makes his leadership more dynamic, and his charity more sincere.

Linda Seneski and Patricia Tindall will attend Marygrove, and Judy Sigler, who won a scholarship to Marygrove does not plan to accept it.

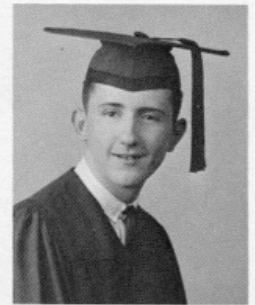
Bernadette Kaczmarek has been awarded a \$100 scholarship to the University of Detroit.



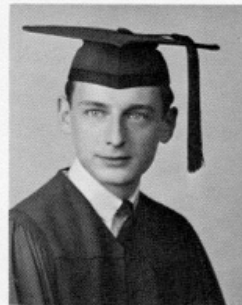

Initiation meant fun for the class, but the officers had to be alert and see that no rules were broken.

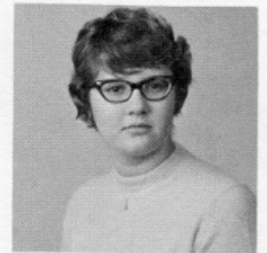
Christmas meant the "At Home" and each officer headed a committee.

"April Interlude" began back in the late Fall, when the officers, together with the PTG, began to make arrangements for the Junior-Senior Prom.

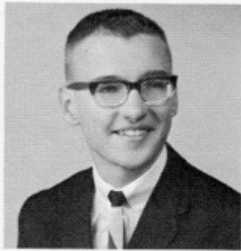
All too quickly June 13 draws near ending the high school years of the Class of 1965, and the labors of their officers to make the last one the best.

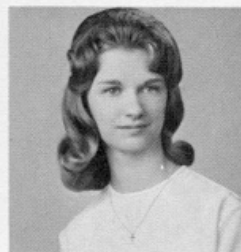

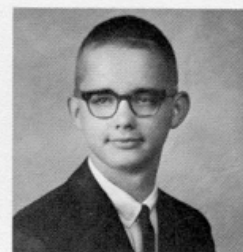

Buildings and scenes, the setting of each year's drama, have fulfilled their function of silent inspiration.

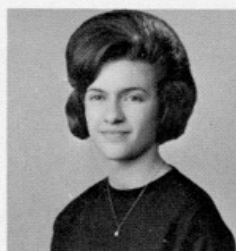
Your curtain call is illuminated by the spotlight of past achievement. You have become well seasoned performers by repeated successes.
